## **Neighbourhood Resilience planning**

In Marlborough, Charlotte is working with TSNS partners, NZ Police, Fire & Emergency NZ and Emergency Management Marlborough to run Neighbourhood Resilience planning workshops. The purpose is to assist Street Coordinators and Neighbourhood Support members in preparing their neighbourhood for emergencies, such as earthquakes, storms, fire or flooding.

The workshops will provide a holistic approach in preparing for emergencies, outlining roles and responsibilities, communication networks and response structures, as well as sources for finding reliable, trustworthy information. You only need to attend one. The dates will be *Monday 1st March, 10am to 12 noon* and *Monday 17th May, 7pm to 9pm*. Charlotte will send out more information soon.
